## Learn Dutch for free!

Do you want a better job? Do you want to be able to talk to the school about your child? Do you want to be able to tell the doctor where it hurts? Rotterdam will help you to learn Dutch – for free!

Learning to speak, write, read and understand Dutch well is important for your future: for you, your partner and your children. We would like you to participate, because, after all, you are also a Rotterdammer!

In Rotterdam you can learn Dutch for free – close to home and at your own pace.

You start with an appointment at the Centraal Inburgeringsloket (Central Integration Bureau or CIL). There you will have an interview and do a test where we will evaluate which method is best for you. After that, you will receive a course in Dutch and you will learn about Rotterdam and the Netherlands. You can also practise using the language by participating in activities at school or in your neighbourhood. You can practise by talking to the neighbours, by participating in sport or by doing volunteer work. Will you take part? Of course – after all you're also a Rotterdammer!

### Do you want to become Dutch?

Integration ('inburgeren') is your chance. In many cases, the integration diploma at A2 level is one of the conditions for obtaining a Dutch passport.

### Taking it further

After obtaining the integration diploma, there are options for a follow-up course: for improving your Dutch or a course to help you find a job. Want to know which courses are available? Go to the CIL or the language course providers (see back page).

### State examination ('staatsexamen')

If you have a high level of education and are working in the Netherlands, the 'staatsexamen' is for you. After the NT2 staatsexamen you can for instance study at a university or college for higher education. Find out more from the CIL or the language course providers (see back page).
